To the Village of Allouez Board:

The Lorelei Inn has set the date for our 2013 Oktoberfest Celebration.

The date is October 5, 2013 from 11:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. This is a request to extend our liquor license to our outdoor event. We also realize that we need to comply with the noise ordinance. We were hoping that we could close off the road from the east intersection of Allouez Place to Webster Ave and to the end of our parking lot entrances. The road would only be closed with movable barriers so any emergency vehicles would have access. Our celebration has grown the past two years and more often than not, the crowds are spilling out into the road. If this road was closed to through traffic, it would further allow the safety of the crowd. We borrow the moveable barriers from Cellcom so they are very sturdy barriers and are also easily moved. We have also employed a security firm to provide safety and protection for our business and also our customers. Last year we had two paid security personnel and this year we are planning on going to four so we can cover all sections of the tent. They would also be patrolling the road if we were able to close it. It would be a great advantage if we were able to close this road.

Last year as in the previous years, we did not charge a cover charge and the entrance to the event was staffed with Allouez Kiwanis Members who checked identification and applied wrist bands. There was no cover charge, but a donation jar. Once again, we were able to present \$1000.00 to each the Allouez Kiwanis Leonard Hack Memorial Scholarship Fund and the March of Dimes in Memory of Carston and Emmitt Arps. This year they will also be the recipients of the donations along with the Green Bay Animal Rescue,

We are anxiously looking forward to Oktoberfest this year. We have heard from our neighborhood businesses that they love the event in this area. The Mexican restaurant across the street said it was an incredibly profitable day for them along with the Webster Avenue Market and the Shell Station. It is a good event for Allouez in general. It was interesting to note that I had On Broadway call me the other day and request the possibility of moving our Oktoberfest down to Leicht dock and allow other establishments to showcase their business similar to what is done in Appleton. I have very mixed feelings about this as it is an Allouez event and we are an Allouez business. I believe we need to stay local.

5.07 SOUND AMPLIFIERS.

The use of sound amplifiers outside buildings within the Village of Allouez is prohibited without a permit to do so from the village. A sound amplifier shall not be operated before 9:00 a.m. or after 9:00 p.m. or in the vicinity of churches while services are being conducted, or near schools that are in session. The village may order a reduction in the volume of an amplifier on complaint being made by a citizen, or when such loud speaker is a nuisance because of the volume, the method in which it is being used, or the location in which it is being operated.
