2014 STREET AND UTILITY RECONSTRUCTION PROJECTS

This summary is intended to establish the next phase of reconstruction projects—to continue the path forward to improve Village utilities and streets.

Hoffman Road 2014 Project

The Hoffman Road reconstruction project, the joint Village/Brown County project, is scheduled for 2014 construction. This is the section from Libal Street to the East River bridge, and includes the proposed roundabout at Libal and Hoffman. The estimated construction cost of the Village portion of this project is \$1,000,000. This project is planned for 2014 and the design will be by the Brown County Highway Department.

Proposed Hoffman Road Expansion to Webster Avenue

The Brown County Highway Department proposes to expand the Hoffman Road project to include the Bellevue section and the section from Libal Street to Webster Avenue. Both of these sections are in need of reconstruction and it is more economical to construct the entire Hoffman Road section at one time. This is proposed for 2014 if the Village of Allouez concurs with proceeding.

The Village portion of the estimated construction cost for the Libal to Webster portion of Hoffman Road is \$900,000. This includes replacing Village underground utilities (water, sewer) because these are in very poor condition. All annual costs are based on a 4% interest rate and a 20-year payment term. The cost estimates for Hoffman Road and the courts are based on original construction plans, and are planning level costs.

Hoffman Road Project Cost Impact

For the above Hoffman Road project from Webster Avenue to the East River bridge, the cost impact is as follows:

\$6.16 per household per year, or \$0.11 per 1000

gallons on sanitary sewer rate.

Hoffman Road Project Cost Impact (Hoffman Road only, no courts)

Project bond borrowing is \$1,900,000 plus issuance cost.

Street Reconstruction

\$17.50 per household per year on taxes.

Water main

\$0.08 per 1000 gallons on water rate.

It is likely that the purchased water rate will decrease by \$0.10 per 1000 gal for 2014.

Sanitary sewer

\$0.14 per 1000 gallons on sewer rate.

This is less than the 2013 increased sewer rate of \$50,000 for Whitney/Betty that will be

removed from the 2014 sewer rate.

Add Patrick/Michael/Capri/Cameo Courts to West Hoffman Road Project

The following is an estimate of the construction cost and financial impact of adding these courts to the east Hoffman reconstruction project.

Project bond borrowing is \$2,500,000 plus issuance costs.

Street Reconstruction

\$22.50 per household per year on taxes.

Water main \$0.11 per 1000 gallons on water rate.

Sanitary sewer \$0.17 per 1000 gallons on sewer rate.
